Autism New Zealand has partnered with Safewill to help our community protect their loved ones in the event of their death. 38% of New Zealanders don't have a legally binding will, which we know can be a challenge for many of our community.

Safewill have make it easy to write your bespoke will online, wherever and whenever suits you best. Their online, guided process takes less than 20 minutes, and is solicitor-reviewed. There is also a live chat and customer support function on the website.

Autism New Zealand's followers and supporters can currently write their will for 50% off the usual cost. All you need to do is head to www.safewill. com/nz/autismnz and get started on the process.
